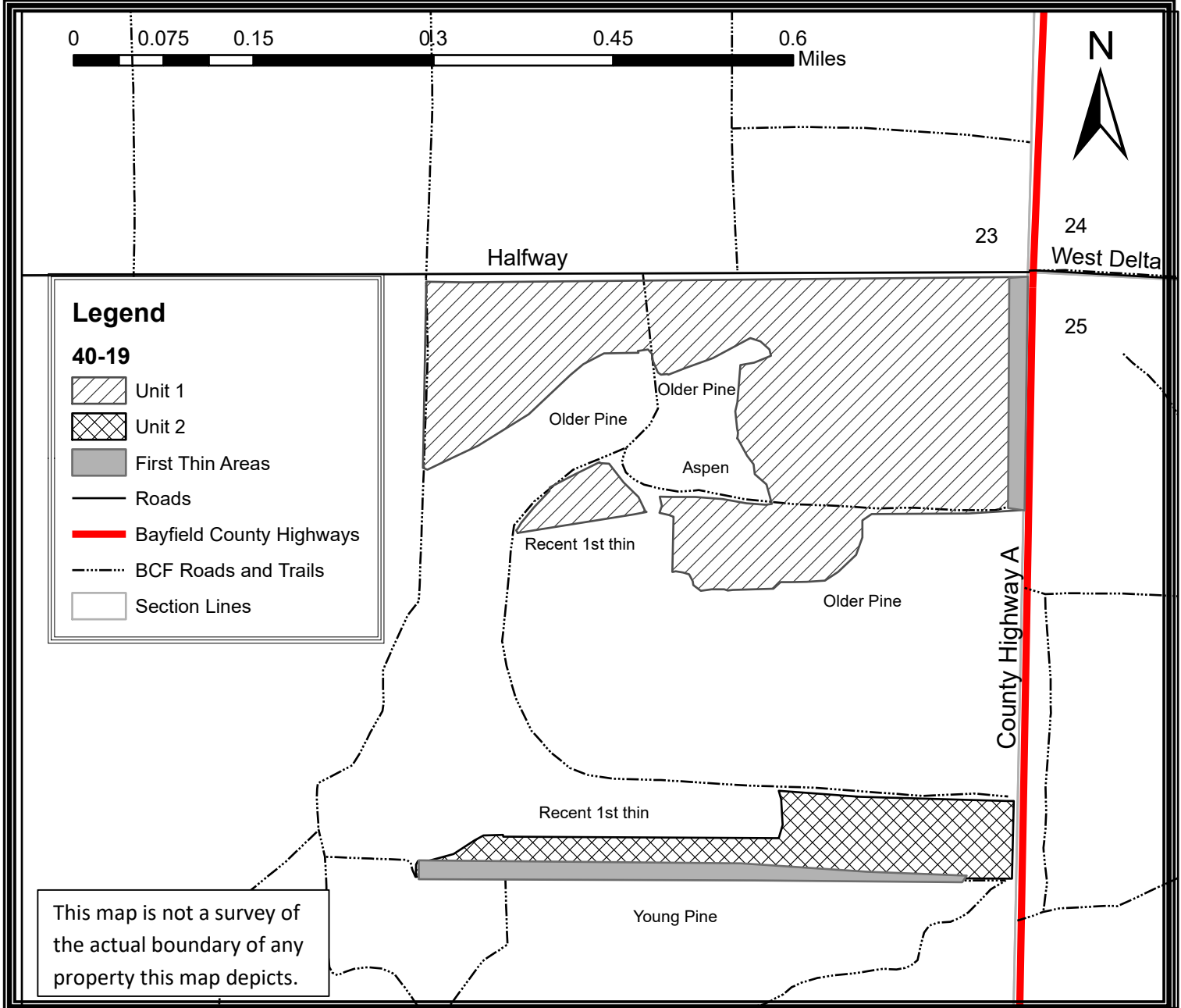

TRACT 40-19 – SUPPLEMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Harvest unit one has a thinning prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 91 ft².
2. Harvest unit two has a thinning prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 89 ft².

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. Harvest unit one: Harvest all orange marked trees. Along County A several rows delineated with vertical line and the words GO written on them indicate first thin area of stand, remove every tree from each GO row.
2. Harvest unit two: Harvest all orange marked trees. Along the South end of stand are several rows delineated with vertical line and the words GO written on them indicate first thin area of stand, remove every tree from each GO row
3. Leave and avoid damage to all unmarked trees.
4. Harvest all trees within 50' of Halfway Road and County Highway A right of way.

C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Harvest unit one has Halfway Road to the North, County Highway A to the East, mature pine plantation to the south, and forest road to the West.
2. Harvest unit two has a recently harvested first thin red pine stand to the North, County A to the East, Young plantation to the South and West.
3. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
4. Harvested pine cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than three weeks from May 1st to August 31st.
5. Do not cut snags except for individuals that pose a safety hazard.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
2. Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.

E. OTHER:

1. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
