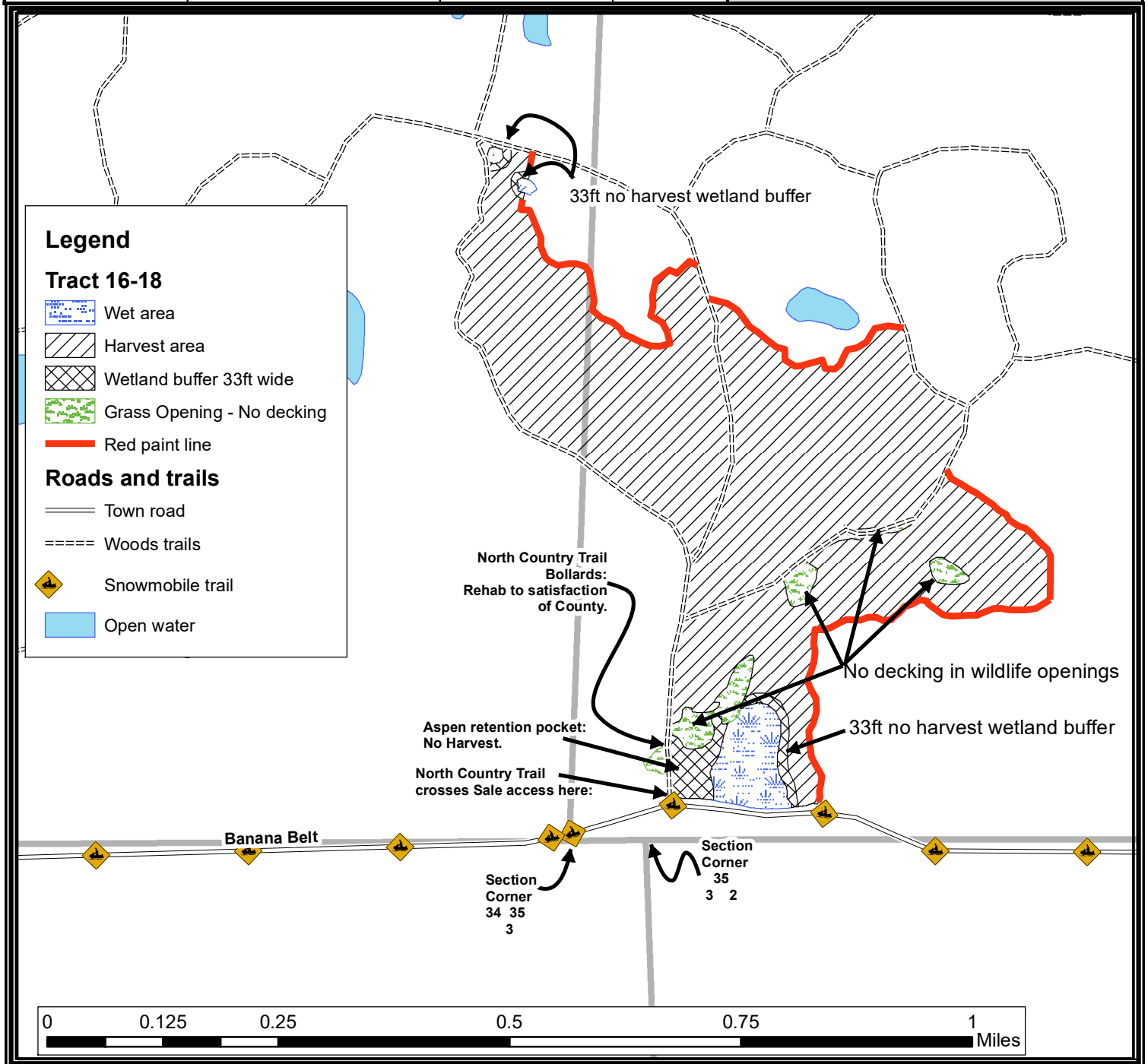

TRACT 16-18 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Aspen coppice harvest, estimated average residual basal area 10 sq.ft./acre. Several small pine patches will have more residual basal area.

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. CUT all aspen, red maple, sugar maple, white birch, jack pine, and balsam fir 2" diameter and larger.
2. LEAVE all red pine, white pine, and oak, including all sub-merchantable saplings of these species. Do not damage these species.
3. DO NOT CUT blue-painted trees along the North Country Trail.

C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS and SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
2. RETAIN a 33ft (1/2 tree length) no-harvest buffer around each of the three wetland areas as indicated on map. No felling of trees and no equipment allowed within wetlands.
3. Ensure slash is crushed within 18 inches of the ground within 25ft of trail.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
2. Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
3. During winter harvesting the snowmobile trail must be kept unobstructed and in a packed snow condition. The purchaser must ensure that harvesting and hauling operations will not create a safety hazard to snowmobiles.

E. OTHER:

1. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
2. Do not damage any survey monumentation.
3. DO NOT deck wood or operate machinery in grassy wildlife openings indicated on map.
