

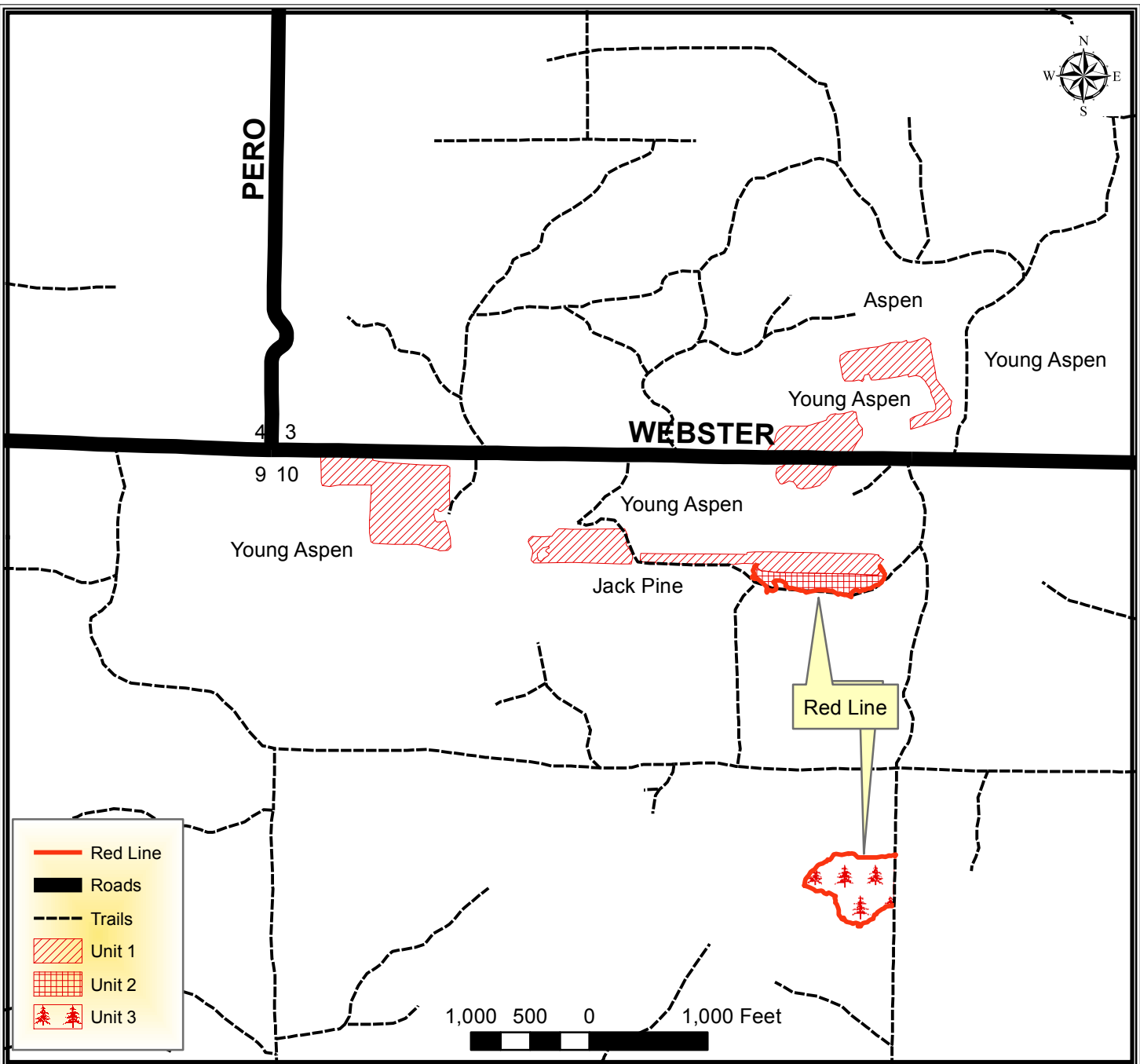

TRACT 32-18 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Harvest unit 1 has a thinning prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 123 ft².
2. Harvest unit 2 has a coppice prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 0 ft².
3. Harvest unit 3 has a clearcut prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 0 ft²

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. In Unit 1, harvest all orange marked trees.
2. In Unit 2, harvest all stems 2 inches and greater
3. In Unit 3, harvest all stems 2 inches and greater

C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, roads, trails and abrupt timber type changes to young aspen, jack pine, marked red pine or aspen.
2. In Unit 1 and 2, do not cut snags except for individuals that pose a safety hazard.
3. In Unit 3, cut all snags.
4. In Unit 1, care must be taken to minimize damage to the residual stand.
5. Harvested pine cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than three weeks from May 1st to August 31st.
6. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
7. Do not damage any survey monumentation.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
2. Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.

E. OTHER:

1. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
