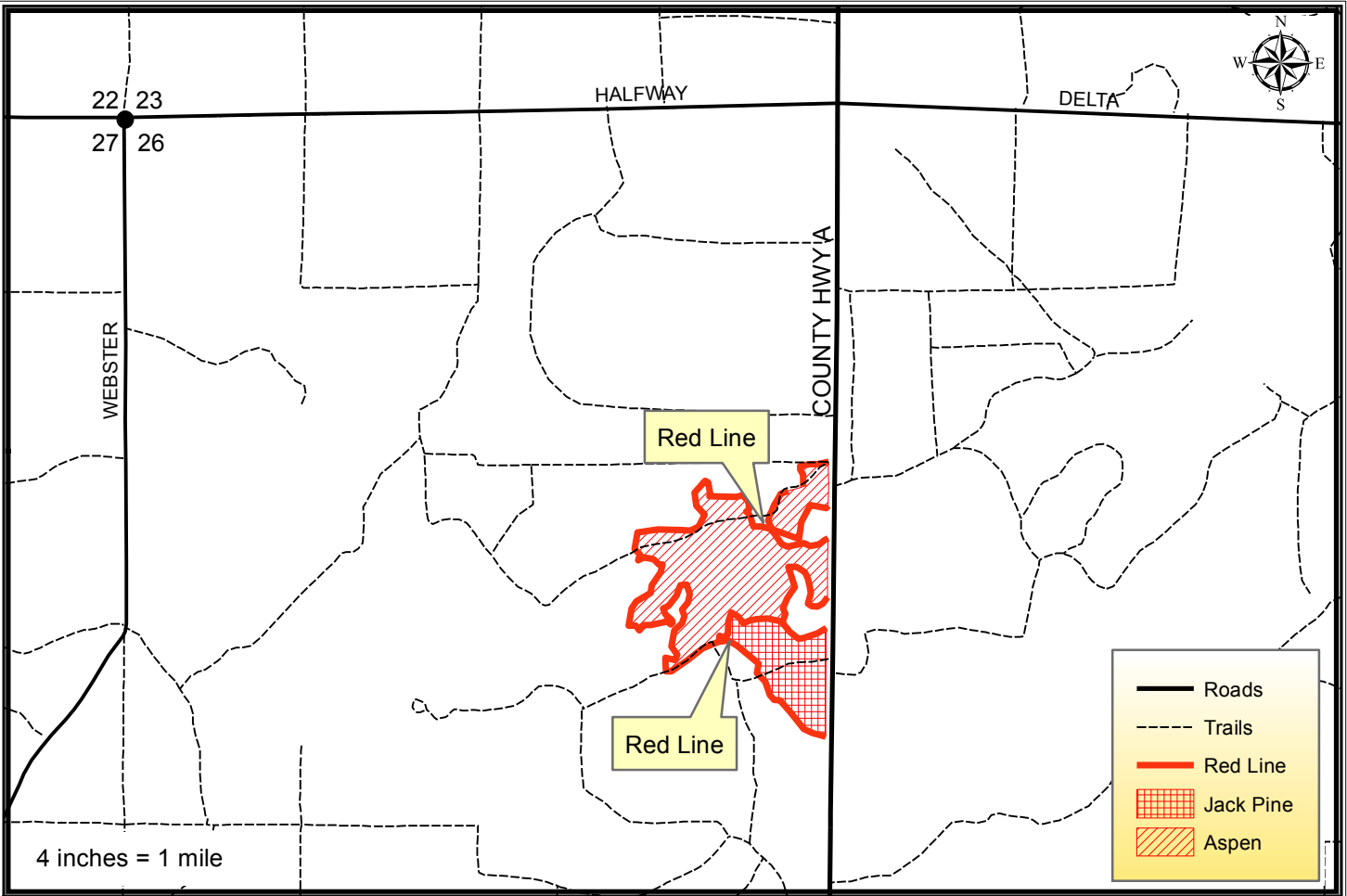

## Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is a clearcut being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis
- **THE JACK PINE UNIT MAY BE WHOLE TREE HARVESTED. WHOLE TREE HARVESTING WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE ASPEN UNIT.**
- Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, roads or trails.
- **Jack Pine Unit:** Cut all stems 2 inches and greater. Unit may be whole tree harvested. Cut all snags. There is approximately 5 sq.ft. of basal area per acre of standing dead PJ scattered throughout the sale area. Any dead trees that the contractor chooses to utilize will be paid for at the contract rates.
- **Aspen Unit:** Cut all hardwood stems 2 inches and greater. Cut all jack pine stems 5 inches and greater. Leave all red and white pine. Do not cut snags except those that pose a safety hazard. Unit cannot be whole tree harvested.
- Harvested pine cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than three weeks from May 1<sup>st</sup> to August 31<sup>st</sup>.
- According to the Bayfield County Access management plan the existing roads within this sale are open to highway vehicle use. Upon completion of the timber sale these roads will be left open unless otherwise directed by the sale administrator.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
