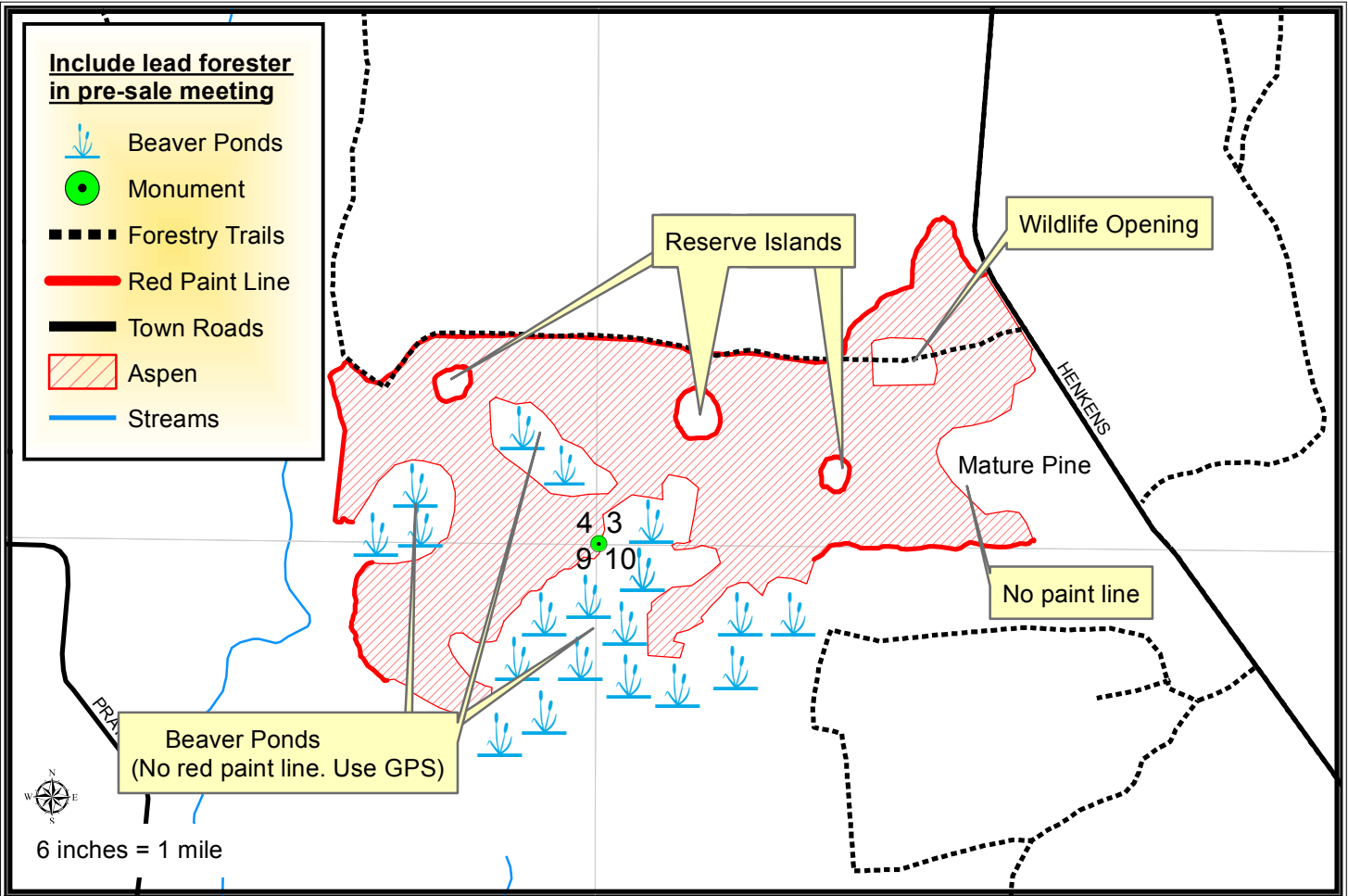

## Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is a clearcut being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis
- Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, recently thinned mature pine, and beaver pond areas. These beaver areas are not marked with red line but a GPS file, or GPS unit if requested, will be provided to assist with staying inside of the timber sale area.
- Sale operations may only occur on frozen or very dry ground as determined by Bayfield County.
- Do not cut any Bur Oak or conifers other than Fir and Spruce. Harvest all other stems, including Fir and Spruce 2" and greater.
- This sale contains 7 trees painted with a purple "X". Operator must harvest these trees above the purple painted ring and lay the tree on the ground as close to the high stump as possible. These trees will create ruffed grouse drumming habitat.
- Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
- Do not damage survey monuments.
- According to the Bayfield County Access Management Plan the existing roads within the sale are closed to motorized use. Prior to the completion of the timber sale roads need to be blocked as directed by the sale administrator.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
