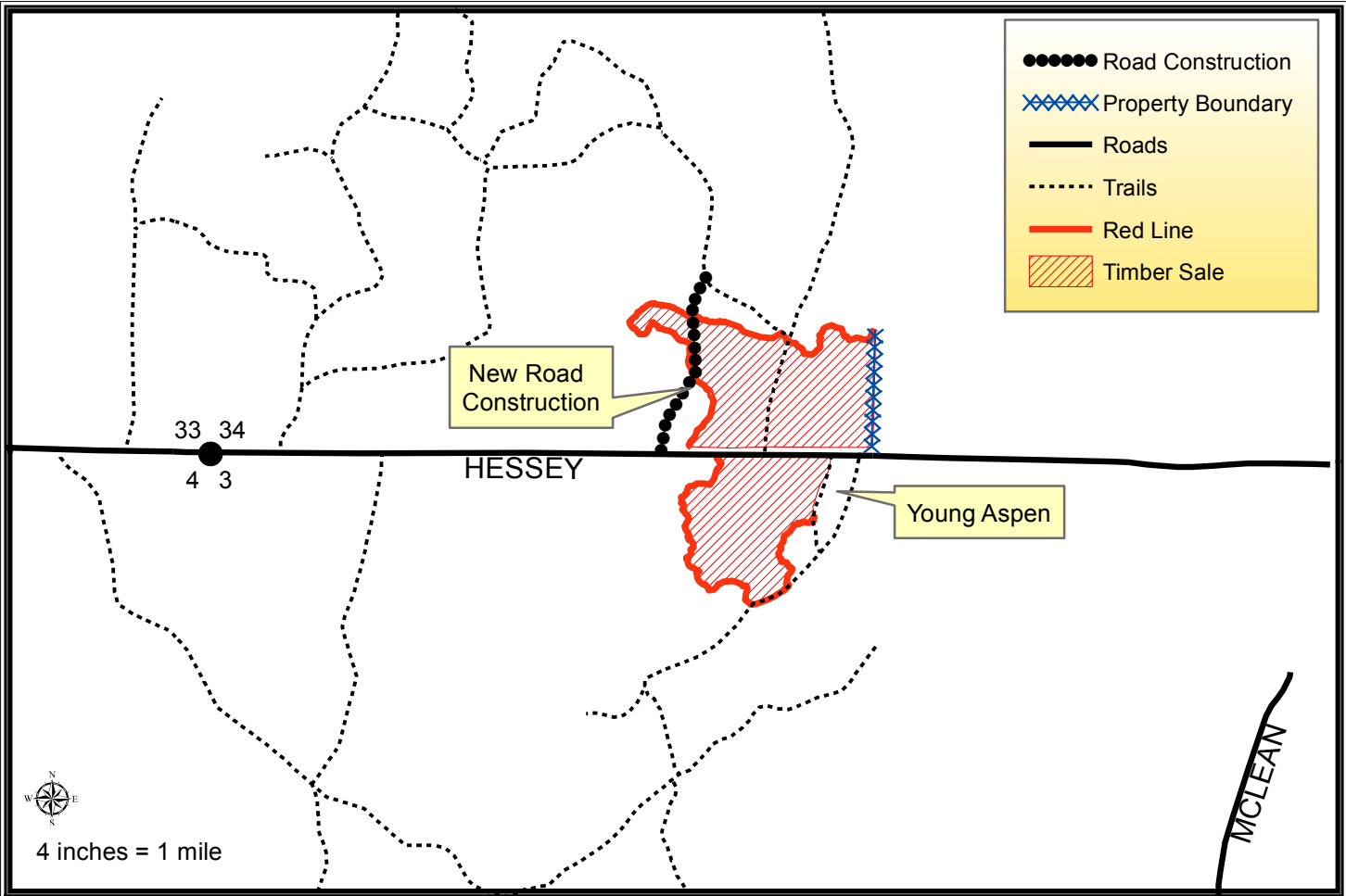

Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is a clearcut being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis
- Sale boundaries consist of red line, blue line, roads and noticeable type changes to young aspen.
- Blue line indicates private property. No equipment or felled trees may cross the line.
- Harvest all unmarked hardwood stems and merchantable spruce and balsam fir. Sever all non-merchantable hardwood stems 2" in diameter and greater.
- Leave all purple marked hardwood and all conifer except merchantable spruce and fir.
- This sale includes several trees that are painted with orange paint. Operator must fell and leave all trees marked with orange. Orange marked trees should be cut 5 ft. above ground level and should lie as close to the high stump as possible. These trees will create ruffed grouse drumming habitat.
- The County is requiring approximately 1,400 feet of new road to be constructed for this sale. Grade shaping, including crowning, ditching (including lead off ditches) and/or sloping, will be required as determined by the County. Road work must occur during non-frozen ground conditions.
- Sale operations may only occur when the ground is frozen unless written permission is granted by Bayfield County.
- Some portions of the sale may be harvested in the summer with new road construction.
- Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
