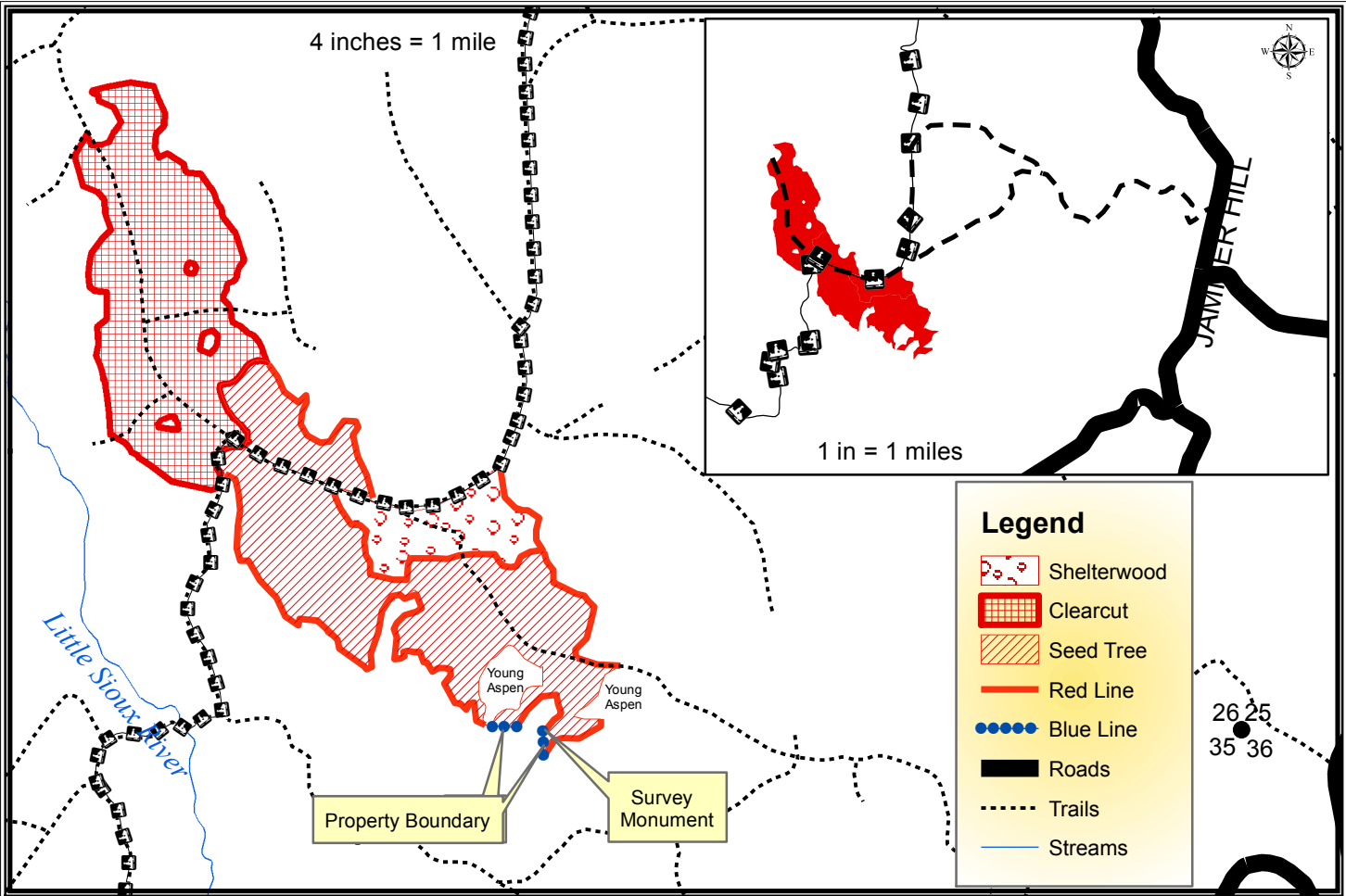

Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis
- Sale boundaries are identifiable on the ground by red paint line, blue paint line, trails or abrupt timber type changes to young aspen.
- The sale is located 2-2.5 miles off of Jammer Hill Road.
- **In All Units:** HARVEST all unmarked merchantable hardwoods, spruce and fir. LEAVE all other conifers and purple marked hardwoods. Sever all non-merchantable hardwood stems 2 inches and greater except oak and white birch.
- The blue line indicates private property. No equipment or felled trees may cross the line.
- This map is not a survey of the actual boundary of any property this map depicts.
- Do not damage any survey monumentation.
- Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
- During winter harvesting the snowmobile trail must be kept unobstructed and in a packed snow condition. The purchaser must insure that harvesting and hauling operations will not create a safety hazard to snowmobiles.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
