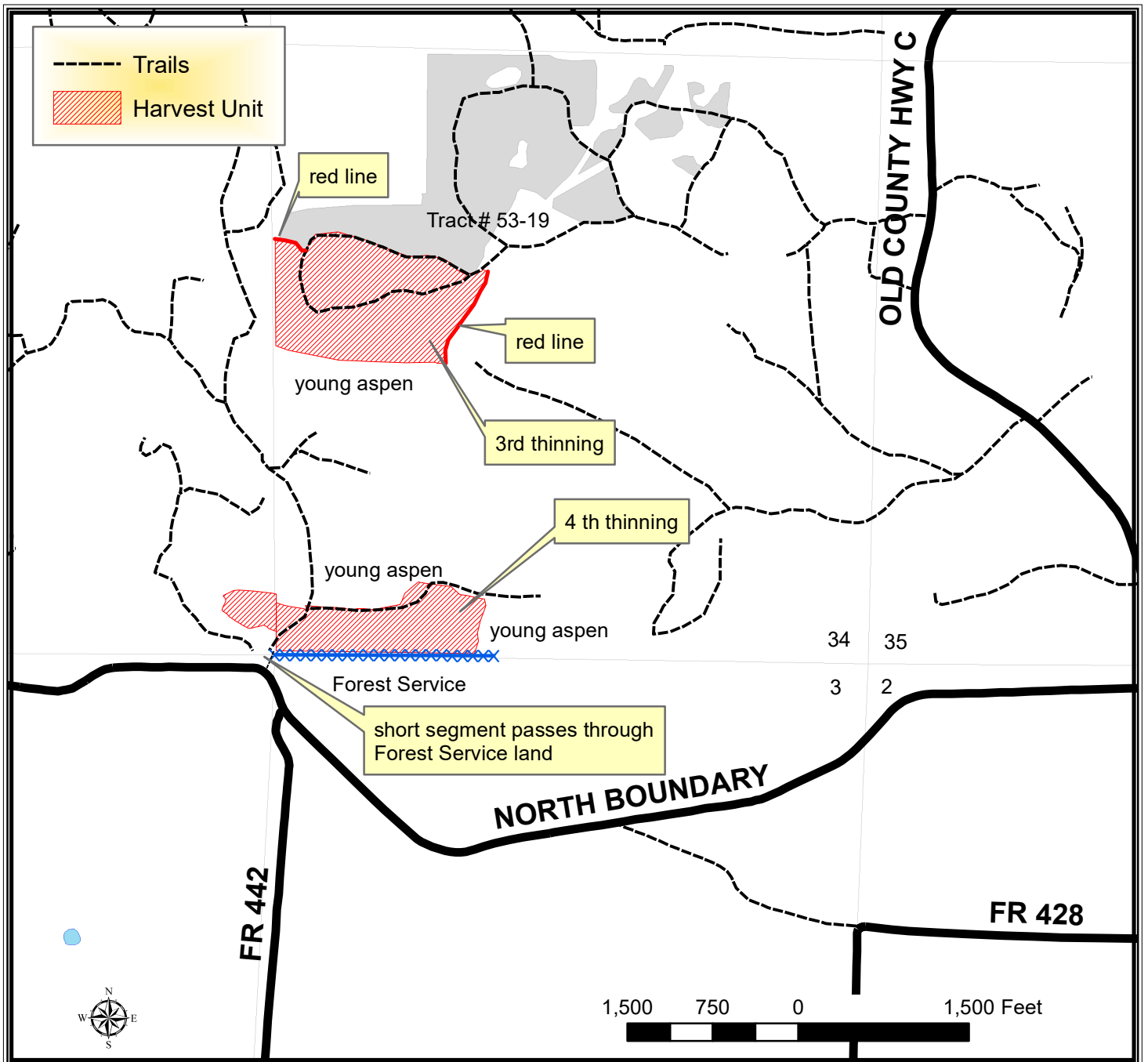

TRACT 38-21 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Harvest unit is a thinning prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 105 ft².

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. Harvest all orange painted trees, merchantable aspen, merchantable maple, and white birch greater than 6 inches DBH. Leave all oak.
2. The merchantable aspen, maple and white birch are present in the northern unit of this sale.

C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, blue paint line, trails, and abrupt timber type changes.
2. Harvested pine cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than three weeks from May 1st to August 31st.
3. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
4. No equipment or trees may cross the blue paint line.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. Access to the southern unit requires crossing a segment of Forest Service property. The County will secure access.
2. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.

E. OTHER:

1. Care must be taken to not harvest trees in adjacent sold sale tract 53-19 as shown on map.
2. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
3. Do not damage any survey monumentation.
