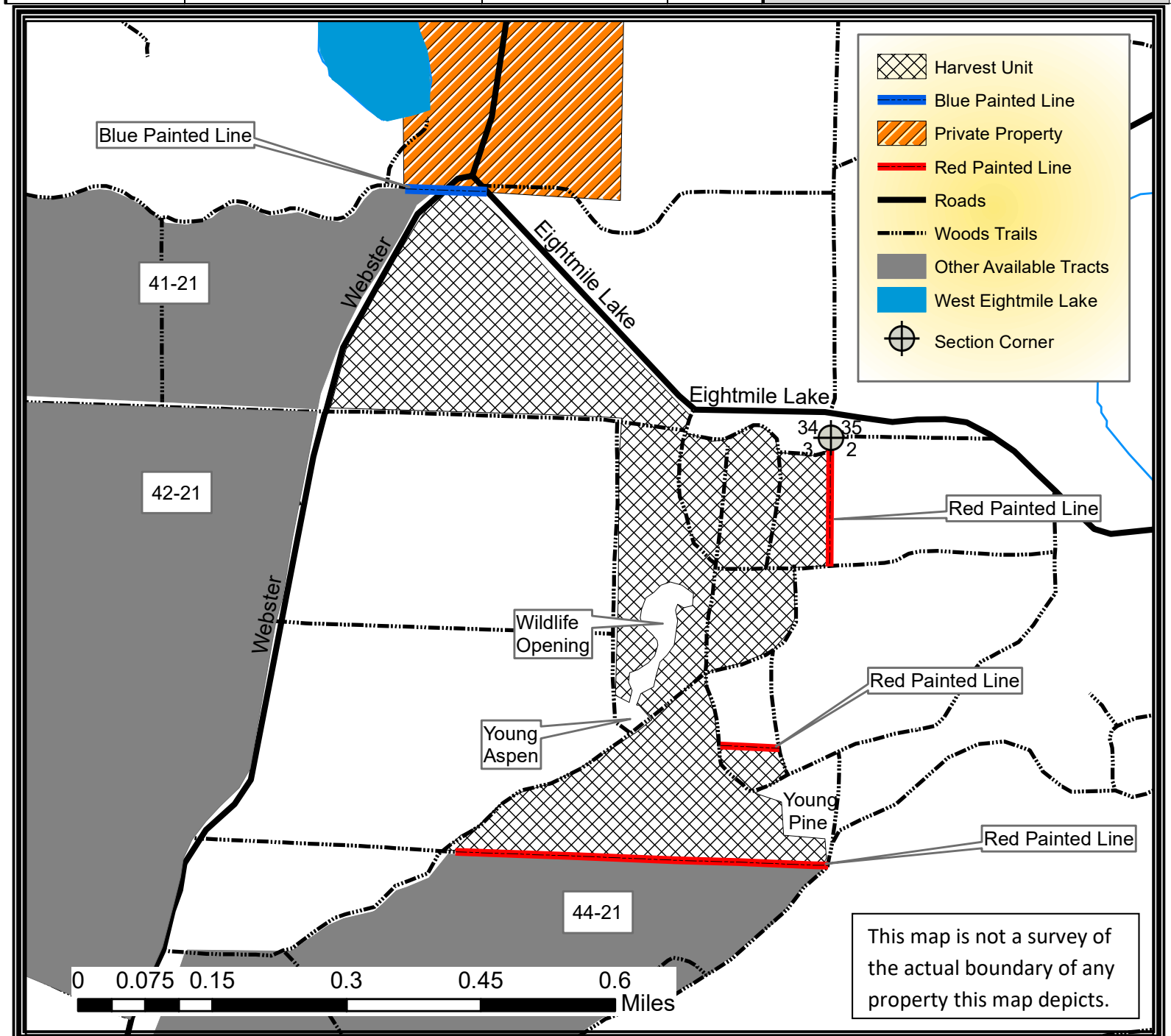

## TRACT 43-21 – SUPPLEMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

### A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. The harvest unit has a thinning prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 101 ft<sup>2</sup>.

### B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

1. Harvest all orange marked trees and harvest all aspen and jack pine 4" or larger within thinning area.
2. Leave and avoid damage to all unmarked trees.

### C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Sale boundaries consist of Webster Road, Eightmile Lake Road, red painted line, harvested jack pine, young aspen, young pine, and timber trails.
2. Do not deck wood or disturb soil in wildlife openings, as indicated on map.
3. Blue painted line indicates private property, no equipment or felled trees may cross this line.
4. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
5. Harvested pine cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than three weeks from May 1<sup>st</sup> to August 31<sup>st</sup>.
6. Do not cut snags except for individuals that pose a safety hazard.
7. Utilization specification is to a 4" top. However, if the County determines that pulpwood markets continue to be very poor at the time of harvest the County will sign a contract amendment with the purchaser changing the utilization specification to a 5" top for selected species. When determining condition of the market, the County will pay particular attention to the amount of wood being purchased by the mills in Wisconsin Rapids and any other significant shifts in wood demand.

### D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
2. Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.

### E. OTHER:

1. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
