-BART is operating normal schedules but is not charging fares currently to eliminate driver/passenger contact. BART buses have Poly barriers up around drivers and is limiting capacity of the buses to 25% to ensure social distancing. BART requires all persons on the bus to wear face masks, if they do not have one BART will provide one. BART completely sanitizes all buses used every night with the use of ozone generators; during the day the driver has spray to spot sanitize the bus.

-Sneeze guards have been installed on the backs of the seats in all buses.
